History

In 2003, St. John Vianney parishioner Colleen Smith sought to help her children grow in their sense of service to others. Together with Mark Peters, then Director of Human Concerns, they came up with the first Summer Service Series. This would give people, with or without their children, a chance to participate in direct service with others whose life circumstances were very different from theirs. That first year, six events were held with great success.

Since then the program has grown. Participants have learned more about efforts in our area to help others, and the organizations that are in the middle of those efforts. Many who participate want to become more involved.

Great Features of Our Summer Service Events:

- Bring awareness to the numerous organizations in our community that serve people with varying needs and altered life situations.
- Stimulate one's interest and motivate activism through diverse opportunities.
- Open to anyone from any of our parishes who wishes to get involved.
- One-time commitment which fits with peoples' busy schedules.
- Coordinated by a leader(s) who plans and directs participants through their experience from start to finish.
- Encourage time to reflect on the experience and process what one encountered through the eyes of our faith.
- Select events that appeal to you and your particular situation. If you have children, there are events that include children of varied ages.
